

P.S. Who took my banana?





## THE LAWGIVERS: Biography of James Franciscus 1934-1991

James Franciscus, the man who played Brent in Beneath The Planet Of The

Apes, passed away on Monday, July 8th 1991. James Grover Franciscus was born on January 31st 1934 in Clayton, MO. He was the son of John Allen and Loraine (Grover) Franciscus. He attended a Massachusetts prep school before going on to Yale University where he received his B.A. in 1957. After acting in the Summer Stock Theatre in Massachusetts, he was cast in his first movie in 1956. In 1958 he started a lengthy career in TV. In 1960 he married Kathleen Kent Wellman on March 28th. He had four daughters: Jaimie, Kellie, Korie and Jolie. In 1963 he won the Quigle Publications' TV Champion Award for Most Promising Male Star. In 1968 he became Vice-President of Omnibus Productions Inc., Ltd. In 1969 he started producing movies besides acting on TV and in the movies. Franciscus died of emphesema on July 8th 1991 at the Medical Centre of North Hollywood,

- JAMES ROBERT PARISH—The Great Science Fiction Pictures—Scarecrow Press, Inc. Metuchen, n.j., 1977 One of the most engrossing sci—fi films of all time. 'Variety' was perceptive enough before the box office bonanza persuaded reviewers to reconsider their earlier judgements—to note that 'it is an amazing film: a political—sociological allegory cast in the mold of futuristic science fiction, the production is an intriguing blend of chilling satire, a sometimes ludicrious juxtaposition of human and ape mores, optimism and pessimism...the totality of the film works very well, leading to a surprise ending although, in hindsight, it would have been deduced all along. et, the suspense, and suspension of belief, engendered is one of film±s biggest assets'.
- BAIRD SEARLES-Films Of Science Fiction and Fantasy-AFI Press, N.Y., 1988 a popular film about crash-landed astronauts on a strange planet suffered from some lapses in logic, but not from underproduction, particularly well done was the architecture of the simian inhabitants, which was believable and handsome.
- PAULINE KAEL-5001 Nights At The Movies-Holt, Rinehart and Winton, N.Y., 1982 - 'this is a picture with its elements carefully engineered-pretty girl, comic relief, thrills, clones-but when expensive hollywood engineering works, the results can be impressive. This is one of the most entertaining sci-fi fantasies ever to have come out of Hollywood. The writing by Michael Wilson and Rod Serling, who adapted Boulles novel Monkey Planet, is often fancy-ironic in the old school of poetic discillusion, but the construction is first-rate. An american astronaut finds himself in the future, on a planet run by apes; the audience is rushed along with this hero, who keeps going as fast as possible to avoid being castrated or lobotimized. All this wouldn't be so forceful or so funny if it weren't for the use of Charleton Heston in the role with his perfect, lean-hipped, powerful body. Heston is a godlike hero; built for strength, he's an archetype of what makes americans win. He doesn't play a nice guy, he's harsh and hostile self-centered and hot tempered. et we don't hate him because he's so magnetically strong; he represents american power - and he has the profile of an eagle.
- STEVEN H. SCHUEFER-Movies On Tv-Bantam Books-Toronto, 1989 rating of 3.5/4 the make-up men who devised the fantastic ape masks rate a special bow.
- MICK MARTIN and MARSHA PORTER-Video Movie Guide 1990-Ballantine Books, N.Y., 1989 Much of the social coment is cutesy and forced, but this remains an enjoyable fantasy rating 4/5.
- LEONARD MALTIN-Tv Movies And Video Guide 1990 Edition-Signet, 1989 rating 3.5/4 only liabilities is somewhat familiar plot, self conscious humor: otherwise, a must-see. Won a special oscar for make-up created by John Chambers.
- LESLIE HALLIWELL-Film Guide 7th Edition-Graftor Books-London, 1989 Stylish, thoughtful science fiction which starts and finishes splendidly but suffers from a sag in the middle. The ape make-up is great. One of the most telling sci-fi films to date. Academy award nomination for music by Jerry Goldsmith.
- ANGELA AND ELKAN ALLAN-Movies on Television-Times Newspaper Ltd-1973 rating 4/6 if you've nothing better to do. Schaffner directs efficiently but without much human or simian understanding.

Of The Apes being aired on TV on Friday, 9/14/73 with a 35.2
rating and a 60 share placing #19th of all time and it was
the highest placing science fiction show ever. Honorary
award went to John Chambers for his make-up design at the
Academy Awards for 1968. National Board of Review Awards
voted Planet Of The Apes #8 best english language film of
1968 (#10 was 2001 A Space Odyssey) Ticket prices for a
movie were \$1.31 in 1968.

PATRICK ROBERTSON-Guinness Film Facts and Feats-Guinness Superlatives Ltd. Middlesex, 1985 - Planet Of The Apes had the largest make-up budget ever of \$1 million which was 17% of total production cost. 8 make-up artists worked under direction of Fox's make-up specialist, John Chambers who won a special Oscar for creating wholly credible ape faces sufficiently mobile to register the full range of human emotions. It took 5 hours for the principal apes to put on their make-up.

### THE PLANET OF THE APES ENCYCLOPEDIA: APE CITY comic series

APE CITY: breakdown of the storyline and scenes (Issue # - page #)

- #1-1 Mongo performs with the band at Fat's Palace and breaks into a fight with some hecklers. After the place is trashed, Mongo departs on the road.
  - 7 The Vindicators' ship lands on Earth's future. Their job is to kill apes.
  - 11 The young ape, Flannagan sees the Vindicators ship while looking for the giant ape Cong.
  - 12 Flannagan brings the crystal from the Vindicators ship to Dr. Benday. Benday pays no attention to him. Flannagan is told to go feed Cong.
  - 14 Mongo is attacked by Baboonjas. He escapes and runs into Rox, the gorilla warior. They travel together.
  - 18 Dr. Reevo tells Big mal to find Benday, for he can give the mob leader power.
  - 20 Baboonjas have a meeting and decide to go to Benday for power.
  - 22 The Vindicators go to their ship and find the crystal missing.
  - 24 Rox and Mongo arrive at Benday's house. They are all attacked by the baboonjas, mobsters and the Vindicators. Cong attacks them all while Benday and crew escape. The three groups fight each other while all trying to find the crystal.
- #2-16 Jo Taylor guards the ship as Benday and group approach. She tells Benday her life story and describes the Vindicators.
  - 22 Mongo heads back to find the crystal. He visits with Cong.
  - 25 Rox and Flannagan leave Benday in search of Mongo.
- #3-1 Hell's Apes run into Mongo. They party together and then Mongo heads for Benday's house.
  - 8 The Vindicators, mobsters and baboonjas are still fighting as they look for the crystal.
  - 11 Benday tells Jo Taylor the history of the planet of the apes.
  - 15 Cong runs into Moriah and Pie from the Vindicators.
  - 18 Mongo dresses up as a mobster and sneaks into Big Mal's group.
  - 22 Rox and Flannagan join the big fight and Dinga and Mongo ride away with the crystal.
- #4-1 An ape sits at home flipping the TV channels.
  - 4 Dinga puts the crystal in his motorcycle and they fly away off to the Vindicators ship.
  - 12 Jo helps the apes and blows up the Vindicators weapons.
  - Jo takes off in the Vindicators ship. Flannagan fights Jo for the crystal. Cong catches the spaceship and throws it into the lake. Cong speaks his first word to Flannagan.
  - 26 The Vindicators reunite with Jo and plan to attack again tomorrow.
  - 27 Benday, Rox, Flannagan and Fats watch Mongo perform at Fat's Palace.

# THE PLANET OF THE APES ENCYCLOPEDIA: APE CITY comic series

APE CITY: Historical Background

During the 20th century a plague effected humans making their civilization crumble only a few years after cats and dogs were killed by a similar plague. Later on a nuclear bomb went off in North America which turned it into a wasteland. Meanwhile Europe was unaffected. Buildings are still intact and food is plentiful but apes have taken over. 'Ape City' takes place in Western Europe around 3950 a.d.

#### APE CITY: A - Z

ADVENTURE COMICS-Comic company that published the 'ape city' mini-series in 1990. AMERICAN EXPRESS 5130-Mongo was a card carrier with this serial number. APE BROADCASTING CORPORATION (ABC)-Television company that broadcast the news across Europe about Benday and the crystal.

APE CITY-An Adventure Comics' release-their second planet of the apes series. \$2.50 cover price per issue, 4 issues in mini-series dated August to

November 1990.

BABOONJAS-A wild, mystical, mysterious and dangerous group of ninja apes who are followers of the true light-they use their powers to find that Benday has the crystal and great power-they tried to slaughter Mongo while he was travelling and they later fought the Vindicators and the Monbsters in search for the

DR. BENDAY (prounounced Beendae)-An old genius orangutan who is working on finding an alternative energy source, trying to understand the technology of the humans since recently power plants are malfunctioning-an electricity specialist who created an experiment that enabled Cong to grow-he lives with Flannagan-hired Rox to be his bodyguard and later tells Jo Taylor the history of the planet of the apes-he is attacked by the Vindicators, Mobsters and the Baboonjas who all want his power and the crystal.

BIG MAL-Leader of the ape mob who wants power from Dr. Benday and the crystal

-he wants to corner the energy market.

BORN TO BE WILD-Mongo sings this song at Fat's Palace. It was originally a #2 hit in 1968 a.d. for the human rock band Steppenwolf.

PAT BROSSEAU-Letterer for all four issues of the 'ape city' mini-series.

GARY CHALONER-Cover illustration for 'Ape City' issue #3.

CHIMPIONSHIP WRESTLING-A TV show featuring gorilla wrestlers like Pandemonius

and Gorilla Monsoon.

CONG-A Gorilla with the body of a monster and the mind of a child-an experiment in genetic enhancement-this baby is now around 150 feet tall and is strong enough to rip the rooftop off of Benday's house to save Benday and he can hear the high pitch from a dog's whistle-bullets only wound him proven by shots from Moriah and Pie.

CRYSTAL-The main power source for the Vindicators in which it controls 3/4 of the power on their ship, the Vindicators are trapped on the planet without it-Flannagan stole it from their ship-the Vindicators, Mobsters and Baboonjas all fight for it at Benday's house. The crystal and the Vindicators ship now sit at the bottom of a lake thanks to Cong throwing

DAN DANKO-Editorial Assistant for all four issues of the 'ape city' mini-series.

DEVON-Human male, member of the Vindicators-technical wiz who had blown up a car with high officials in it and because of this he was put in the Vindicators.

DINGA-Gorilla leader of Hell's Apes and a friend of Mongo-his motorcycle was able to fly after he put the crystal in his gas tank.

EAST SIDE MOBSTERS-Mobsters from the other side of the city who come to help Big Mal's mobsters fight the Vindicators and the Baboonjas while looking for the crystal.

FATS-Owner of Fats' Palace and an old friend of Mongo.

FATS' PALACE-Europe's hottest night club owned by Fats-Mongo sang here with the band and also started a fight which nearly destroyed the place, the palace was re-opened and Mongo would perform there again.

FLANNAGAN-Teenage ape who lives with and helps Dr. Benday-He feeds and looks after Cong-He discovered the crystal while wandering on to the Vindicator's ship and later brought it back to Dr. Benday.

MITCH FOUST-Cover painting for 'Ape City' issue #1

GORILLADO-A gorilla tv talk show host.

GORILLA MONSOON-A Gorilla wrestler on Chimpionship Wrestling tv program. HELL'S APES-Gorilla gang led by Dinga who ride motorcycles, fight and party.

I'M A BELIEVER-Mongo sings this song as he travels with a bag and a guitar. This song was originally a #1 hit in 1966 a.d. for the human rock group called The Monkees.

JO TAYLOR-Young human woman who volunteered for the Vindicators-She helps the apes escape death once but does go on to fight Flannagan. Her father was the famous astronaut Taylor. Jo joined the space program to learn about her father's disappearance. She found records of the true facts and she then wanted to kill apes to create an equal balance between apes and humans so that the humans might still have a chance to rule over the apes when her father lands on Earth in the future.

KRAK-Leader of the Baboonjas (ninja baboons) who have very magical powers. LEADER OF THE PACK-Mongo sings this song on the road while travelling to find the crystal. This song was originally a #1 song in 1964 a.d. by the female human group called The Shangri-La's.

LENNY-Member of the mob run by Big Mal-He is ordered by Big Mal to beat up Rocco and he helps search for the crystal while fighting the Vindicators and the Baboonjas.

MARVIN PERRY MANN-Inker for the 'Ape City' mini series-all four issues. CHARLES MARSHALL-Writer of the 'Ape City' mini-series-all four issues.

He gave introductorial comments and personal views in all four issues.

TOM MASON-Creative Director for all four issues of the 'Ape City' mini-series.

MATING GAME-A TV show where apes of the opposite sex meet each other.

STEVE MILLER-Tonework for the 'Ape City' mini-series-all four issues.

MONGO-Gorilla singer/fighter/mercenary/lover/free spirit who sang at Fats' Palace-After starting a fight there he left the club and went traveling with his guitar-He was attacked by wild Baboonjas before meeting up with Rox-He tried to find the crystal before anyone else did-He escaped with Dingo on the latter's flying motorcycle-He returned once again to sing at Fats' Palace.

THE MONKEE'S THEME SONG-Mongo sang this song at Fats' Palace-It was originally the opening theme for the TV show The Monkees in 1966.

MONKEY-Song performed by an ape rock group on MTV-It was originally a hit which went to #1 in 1988 by the human singer George Michael.
