

(Various studios, 1960s-1990s) Mind-boggling assortment (3000++) of entertainment-related promotional giveaway pinback buttons, also with selected groups of cloth patches, keyrings, bottle-openers, and other similar tchotchkes. Highlights include Marvel and DC comics superheroes, Disneyland and Disney film titles, and many hundreds of films big and small like Blade Runner, Boogie Nights, Point Break, Stop Making Sense, Beetlejuice, Night of the Living Dead, 12 Monkeys, plus personality promotions for Elvis Presley, Jerry Lewis, John Wayne, William Shatner and so much more. Most are multiples ranging from a few to dozens each (even to the degree of multiple unopened boxes of 144/per vintage "Snoopy" buttons). The phenomenal breadth and variety of the items included must be previewed to be properly appreciated. 2084. Archive of (300+) film and television scripts. (Various studios, 1930s-1990s) Extensive vintage archive of (300+) scripts from film and television productions throughout much of the 20th century. Many are original in studio-printed covers, some with rainbow correction pages, and several are cast or crew signed. Highlights include Young Frankenstein, Jaws 2, Tora, Tora, Tora, The Thing (John Carpenter version), Miss Sadie Thompson, Animal House, Hello, Dolly!, North to Alaska, Charlie's Angels (TV), Full House (signed by John Stamos), The Painted Veil (1934), Ivanhoe, Loose Woman, No Face (signed by Nancy Kwan), Planet of the Apes (TV), Rocky Horror Picture Show (signed by Barry Bostwick), The Royal Tenenbaums (signed by Owen Wilson and Wes Anderson), Unbreakable (signed by M. Night Shyamalan) and much, much more. Also includes awards consideration copies and other printed script variations, plus a number of extensive wardrobe bibles filled with costume continuity photos. 2086. Gargantuan archive of vintage 35mm film frames and coming attraction trailers (Various Studios, primarily 1950s-1990s) Many, many hundreds of small boxes, most containing clipped 35mm theatrical feature film frames, and the rest containing complete intact 35mm theatrical coming attraction trailers, many still wrapped within their original NSS bindings. The quantity of clipped frames is impossible to accurately estimate, as it is conceivable they could number as many as one million, though for cataloging purposes we will state (100,000++) of which many are separated within their boxes in small identified envelopes. This tradition dates from a time before VCRs or other home viewing technology, when fans of films were so frantic to possess viewable images from their favorite films they would purchase individual film frames for slide-show projection, as well as using them as color transparencies to print color enlargements for collecting purposes. Quite a number of these clipped single frames are already mounted into individual cardboard slide mounts within titled boxes, while the remainders are either loose or enveloped as stated above. Just as the total frame count is impossible to gauge, so is the variety of titles, as it is quite likely they exceed (1000+) for these clipped film frames. As for the intact trailers, there are at least (300+) and quite likely many more, the majority of which are boxed individually with title labels. Titles include Star Wars, Star Trek, Trading Places, Annie, Tron, The Last Unicorn, Cujo, Vice Squad, Planet of the Apes, The Poseidon Adventure, Papillon, The Prodigal, Paper Moon, Pat Garrett and Billy the Kid, Tea and Sympathy, Taxi Driver, Song of the South, The Sting, Summer of '42, 2001: A Space Odyssey, The Towering Inferno, Tommy, 20,000 Leagues Under the Sea, The Time Machine, East of Eden, Enter the Dragon, The Exorcist, Forbidden Planet, Easy Rider, Funny Girl, Scarface, Rumblefish, Fast Times at Ridgemont High, Rocky III, Golden Voyage of Sinbad, Psycho 2, Peter Pan, The Enforcer, The Way We Were, Mahogany, Lady Sings the Blues, Charlotte's Web, The Cincinnati Kid, Coming Home, The Cowboys, The Countess from Hong Kong, Cool Hand Luke, The Collector and on and on throughout the alphabet. Please keep in mind when considering this truly gargantuan lot that the clipped frames are harvested from 35mm motion-picture film, which includes an incorporated sound strip for projection, therefore the actual image size in each frame is somewhat smaller than if the same film contained images from a still camera. On the other hand, these are virtually all original, first-generation source images of the highest definition, since they were called upon to project a sharp image onto a giant theatrical screen hundreds of feet from the light source. Mounted and loose frames appear unabused and clean, and should produce exceptional color enlargements should one so choose. The trailers for the most part appear soft, dry, and flexible for smooth projection, with only a handful appearing stiff, stuck or deformed from storage.
