371 Klingon Costume Components Star Trek: The Original Series (1966-1969)

Klingon costume components from Gene Roddenberry's sci-fi series Star Trek: The Original Series. The Klingons, fierce enemies of the Federation at that time, wore their distinctive costumes throughout their multiple run-ins with the crew of the starship Enterprise.

This lot consists of a sleeveless gold-color synthetic fabric vest with black horizontal striping and a pair of loosely woven black and gold-color synthetic ribbon leggings. The leggings exhibit fraying around the ankles, and the vest is stained on the left chest from wear.

THE **JOHN CHAMBERS**COLLECTION

Renowned film and TV makeup artist John Chambers was born on September 12, 1922 in Chicago, Illinois. He served during World War II as a dental technician, and later worked at the Veterans Affairs hospital in Hines, Illinois, where he repaired faces and made prosthetic limbs for wounded veterans. In 1953, Chambers joined NBC, having previously trained under Ben Nye and worked as a makeup artist for live productions. After a six-year period at the network, Chambers completed his first film, Around the World in Eighty Days, which won the Academy Award® for Best Picture and launched his long career in Hollywood.

Under contract with Universal Pictures, Chambers first gained recognition for his work on both The List of Adrian Messenger and Gene Roddenberry's seminal sci-fi series Star Trek, for which he created the prosthetic Vulcan ears worn by Leonard Nimoy. Chambers then achieved global recognition for Planet of the Apes, which earned him an Academy Honorary Award for his groundbreaking prosthetic makeup from The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences in 1968 and cemented a long-standing association with the beloved franchise. The CIA even contracted Chambers to coach its operatives on creating disguise kits in the 1970s, for which he was awarded the agency's Intelligence Medal of Merit after the 1979 Iran hostage crisis was declassified.

John Chambers died on August 25, 2001, leaving behind an unparalleled legacy of innovation and artistry in makeup. Over Chambers' career, several other accomplished makeup artists received his tutelage, including Michael Westmore, Maurice Stein, Thomas R. Burman, Michael McCracken, David Dittmar, and many more, and his work remains on display at the International Spy Museum in Washington D.C. 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John Chambers Collection: Spock's (Leonard Nimoy) Wax Prosthetic Ear Sculpts

Star Trek: The Original Series (1966-1969)

Spock's (Leonard Nimoy) wax prosthetic ear sculpts from the adventure-sci-fi series Star Trek. Spock served as first officer under Captain James T. Kirk (William Shatner) aboard the USS Enterprise.

This lot comes from the collection of SFX makeup artist John Chambers. It consists of two wax pointed ear prosthetics; an 8.5" x 10" black-and-white photo of Spock with a label "Leonard Nimoy's Dr. Spock ears were a production of John Chambers expertise" and handwritten annotations "I created the ears for Mr. Spock in 1965 or 1966" and "I took 2 impressions of Leonard Nimoy's ears for Star Trek on June 1, 1966 at 3:30 pm and April 17, 1968"; two color images of Nimoy and Chambers in makeup; and 44 pages of receipts with handwritten annotations from Chambers inside a manila folder with hand annotations. 1090 Light-Up DARPA Light Cannon **Pixels (2015)**

A light-up DARPA light cannon from Chris Columbus' comedy-fantasy film Pixels. DARPA soldiers and Brenner wielded light cannons as they fought against alien video games. This lot consists of a black nylon strap, a gray- and black-painted urethane cannon featuring a clear acrylic panels at the front of four barrels, two black flashlights, two gray-painted urethane handles with one featuring a red-painted start button, and artificial buttons and panels. This cannon lights up when the flashlights are powered. This lot exhibits minor scuffs and a bent back piece from production use. 1091 DARPA Wrist Light Cannon Pixels (2015)

A DARPA wrist light cannon from Chris Columbus' comedy-fantasy film Pixels. DARPA soldiers and Brenner wielded light cannons as they fought against the alien video games. This lot consists of a gray and black painted urethane cannon featuring a clear acrylic etched panel at the front of the barrel with lights, chrome-color painted urethane batteries with vinyl stickers, a caution-designed vinyl sticker along the back, and two black nylon fastening straps. This lot is non-functional and exhibits scuffs along the left side, including a detaching piece from the barrel. 1092 Gorilla Soldier Rifle Beneath The Planet Of The Apes (1970)

A gorilla soldier rifle from Ted Post's sci-fi sequel Beneath the Planet of the Apes. Ape soldiers carried crude brown rifles that resembled modified M1 Carbines throughout the film. This rifle features a sculpted, solid wood body painted reddish-brown with a dowel added at front and painted black to resemble a barrel, a separate midsection bolt and sight element painted black, and two metal brackets with a black nylon shoulder strap affixed are screwed into the wood. It exhibits various nicks, scuffs, and scratches throughout its finish from production use and handling. Dimensions: 35" x 6" x 2" (89 cm x 15.25 cm x 5 cm)

1093 Hero Gorilla Costume Planet Of The Apes (1968)

A gorilla soldier costume from Franklin J. Schaffner's sci-fi classic Planet of the Apes. Astronaut George Taylor (Charlton Heston) encountered groups of super intelligent apes after he landed on a futuristic version of Earth. This costume consists of a dark brown ribbed leather vest (size 40) with snap buttons marked "2954-1"; brown canvas trousers (size 30x31) marked "2954-3"; and a brown, black leather, and canvas shoulder sling with pouches. This lot exhibits discoloration from age.

1094 Chimp Mask Planet Of The Apes (1968)

A chimp mask from Franklin J. Schaffner's sci-fi classic Planet of the Apes. Astronaut George Taylor (Charlton Heston) encountered groups of super intelligent apes after he landed on a futuristic version of Earth. This chimp mask is made of black painted latex rubber with white painted teeth and black synthetic hair. The mask features a slit opening in the back for easier wear access. This lot exhibits glue residue around the chin and neck and sympathetic repair done to the synthetic hair.

A background gorilla soldier uniform from Franklin J. Schaffner's sci-fi classic Planet of the Apes. After landing on a futuristic version of Earth, astronaut George Taylor (Charlton Heston) encountered groups of super intelligent apes, including gorillas who served as soldiers. This costume consists of a dark brown faux leather vest with snap buttons, a purple buttonup canvas long-sleeve shirt, and matching trousers. It includes a brown canvas sash with faux leather pouches, and green gloves with dark brown synthetic leather cuffs. The Western Costume tag in the vest displays the production number "2431-1," and is marked for chest "42." The inside of the vest is also hand-marked with "42." The lot exhibits scuffing in the leather and discoloration to the shirt and trousers.

A background orangutan mask from Franklin J. Schaffner's sci-fi film Planet of the Apes. After landing on a futuristic version of Earth, George Taylor (Charlton Heston) encountered super intelligent apes, including orangutans who served as political and religious leaders. This mask is made of latex with brown-painted skin, orange hair applied throughout, and fastening strips in the rear to close it on the wearer. It exhibits some hardening to the latex and a few scuffs in the painted finish of the face.

1096 Zira's (Kim Hunter) Facial Appliance Planet Of The Apes (1968)

Zira's (Kim Hunter) facial appliance from Franklin J. Schaffner's sci-fi film Planet of the Apes. Doctor Zira was an animal psychologist who helped George Taylor (Charlton Heston) and Nova (Linda Harrison) escape. This lot consists of a foam latex facial appliance for the brow, nose, cheeks, and chin, painted brown with yellow teeth, with a white vacuum-formed plastic lifecast labeled "New Kim." The appliance exhibits dried and cracked edges, and has come loose from the lifecast. Dimensions: 7" x 11" x 5.5" (18 cm x 28 cm x 14 cm)



The scrapbooks feature collections of military insignias and badges, as well as photographs from World War II, maps and paper clippings. Betty Parker's (Joan Allen) costume from Gary Ross's fantasy comedydrama Pleasantville. Betty wore her dress at David (Tobey Maguire) and Bill's (Jeff Daniels) trial. This costume consists of a yellow rayon button-up V-neck jacket with a gray and yellow polka-dot hem; a sleeveless yellow rayon sheath dress also hemmed with gray and yellow polka-dot trim; a yellow belt; and three production tags. The dress features an interior tag reading "Ms. Joan Allen." The production tags are hand-marked "55," "53," "Betty," and "Joan Allen" for scenes "197-200" change "7" along with additional notes. This costume exhibits snagged threads and discoloration at the hem.
