

On September 17, 1928 in London, England, Roderick Andrew McDowall was to Thomas and Winfred McDowall. Roddy has been in the motion picture business since he was 8, and he will be 47 in the fall.

The young child became a lover of motion pictures and such and his own mother's dreams were to become an actress. His first ambitions were to be a priest, and he kept that ambition even after making his first film Murder in

the Family. But his interests soon turned to the field of acting.

With the release of Murder in the Family, Roddy, as be was called, became a tremendous success with the Britons. By the time he was 12 years old he had made fifteen films including the Outsider, This England, and a British spy film called Confirm or Deny. It was the latter film that impressed Darryl F. Zanuck so much that he sent for Roddy and his family. They moved to Hollywood where a motion picture contract was waiting at 20th Century Fox.

How Green Was My Valley in 1939 that scored such a big hit with the American public that it established doddy ws an up and coming super talent. And his next film, Lassie Come Home scored an even bigger hit. It was in the film that Roddy met his now long time friend, Elizabeth Taylor. While they were young, Both of their names were romantically linked --- only they know if the rumors were true.

Other renowked people he befriended were Tuesday Weld, Barbara Stanwyck, and Ava Gardner. Ms. Gardner has an undying devotedness to Roddy as proved by the inscription on a photgraph hanging in Roddy's home. It reads, "Dear Roddy, it's obvious I lovem trust, honor, and obey you -- I do. Love Ava. And Roddy has nothing but compliments for Ava, "Ava as a goddess. She doesn't know it but she is. A combination of queen and peasant."

Late in his "young" career, he got tired of being typecast as the mensitive little boy so he whet to the stage. He got rave reviews for his portrayal of Octavius in Julius Caesar----a role he lated recreated in the very strong film

Cleopatra. McDowall had arrived as the complete actor.

In 1968 he accepted his most controversial role, and certainly the most demanding of his career -- he had agreed to play Cornelius in the screen version of Pierre Boulle's Planet of the Apes. The movie character was a very intelligent and articulate ape and Roddy welcomed the chance to play the challengeing role. When it was all over, Roddy had earned the compliments of Judith Christ. Rex Reed and the majority of Hollywood's most important critics --- Planet of the Apes was a tremendous box office success. As we know, Planet was follwed by four other films, in all five film classics, Roddy starred in four of the films, missing one because of another film commitment. But Hoddy has really become the superstar of the screen. This led to many belevision contracts and to the now defunct television series in which Roddy starred and for which Roddy was considered for an Emmy nomination. Roddy is more than an actor, he is a fine

Roddy is more than an actor, he is a fine photographer and a very fine comedien, Roddy is a product of a generation of film greats from Europe and he has assumed his rightful spot near the top of the film world. We honor him as the Hall of Fame winner in the firs annual election. Roddy, we salute you and make the rest of your career be as great as the past 47 years!!

Kim Hunter syrocketed to fame early in her now long career when she starred with Marlon Brando in the film classic, "Streetcar Named Desire"/ The role of Stella was almost written for her. She was just outstanding. The film is the story of a beautiful girl who was betrayed by love. Blanche DuBois. (played by Jessica Tandy) tormented by the memory of her tragic marriage and the scandal she had started in the small Southern town in which she lived, flees to New Olreans to find refuge with her sister. But her sensual, crude brother-in-law (played by Marlon), resents her presence and her stifles any chance she has of regaining her pride and self-confidence.

When the play was first presented in Devember of 1947 all eyes were on the new sensation Marlon Brando. But as the play moved on, it bacame apparent that the new people to watch were Kim Hunter and the unknown Karl Malden. Kim captivated the audience with her sensitive portrayal of Stella Kowalski---husband of Stanley, the character Brando played. Throughout the production, Kim pleads withs Brando to have some compassion, but he refuses and the play ends in tragedy.

Then the most successful play in New York theatre of 1947 went to the screen. Kim Hunter was tabbed as Stella again, and for her efforts she received hundreds of rave reviews. The motion picture

itself received a number of Academy Awards.

So in 1968 when Kim was asked to play Zira in The Planet of the Apes it was a difficult decision for her. She had a successful theatre career and a very prosperous motion picture list. Yet she decided, Like her counterpart, Roddy McDowall, that thefilm would be a challenge and a chance for her to spread her wings---so she accepted the tole of the kind, compassionate, chimpanzee doctor.

Kim too received many rave reviews for her sensational portrayal of the chimp. She has become one of the most popluar chimps in the entire Ape film series. The reasons for this is that we all identify with her in her role of the inquisitive scientest who feels compassion and love for her fellow apes as well as for the lower species——humans. Who will ever forget her closing line in The Planet of the Apes when she allowed Chuck Heston to kiss her saying. "O.K. but you're so ugly""? That line established Kim as the most sensitive of all the ape characters.

In the last seven years Kim has appeared in many television shows but she has chosen to take a low profile. She has seemingly accomplished nearly all any actress can. Yet we cherish her appearances in Cannon, Hec Ramsey, (now in syndication), and Gunsmoke. Kim is so rarely seen that whenver you have the chance to see her, do---you'll be pleased at the charisma she gives you as you

watch her do her thing.

So, we salute Kim Hunter as the runner up in the first annual Hallz of Fame Election. It is with a great amount of love and pride that we formally induct her. No one has given individual performances like Kim in her ape role. Our Hat's off to the one and the only Kim Hunter!!!!
