





The column this issue will be a little different; first, let me make a few corrections to the last column. The manuscript I sent in was typed. I typed it because I thought it would be easier for the club typist when she put the bulletin together. Unfortunately some errors were made. The letter "E; was often substituted for "O" giving rise to the error that the mutant leader was called KELP rather than the correct KOLP. Another error was the sentence "His insanity easily perserves the peaceful colony of Apes into a bloodthirsty and dangerous enemy." That sentence doesn't make sense, the word perserves should be perverts. Please accept my apologies for these errors.

The discussion this time will be devoted to the issue of capitalizing the names of the various ape planet inhabitants. First of all, let me say that in the past I have been inconsistent in my writings, using "Ape" and "ape" or "Mutant" or "mutant" interchangably, and it is now time to take a more definite stand.

It has long been acknowledged that the names of certain categories of men are capitalized (i.e. Indian, Negro, etc.). Also, the nationality of an individual is capitalized, as in the case of American, German, French, etc. The practice of capitalizing nationalities began almost as early as history itself, but capitalizing the names of races of men is a fairly modern development. In the 1800's, the pioneers of the American West battled "indians" or "injuns" while the United States' Cavalry received government orders to defend the pioneers from the "Indians", capitalization being an insturument of diplomacy. Gradually through heavy usage the government perpetuated the capitalization, although it was often merely part of a formal title which would have been capitalized anyway (i.e. The Bureau of Indian Affairs).

The capitalization of "Negro" was slower in coming, owing mainly to the hereditary racial prejudice of the modern day descendants of former slaveowing Southern gentlemen, who regared the Negro as his inferior. It wasn't until the early 1930's that the 'solid south' begrudgingly surrendered to popular practice.

Now when one visits a zoo, they may perhaps see "apes", inarticulate beings of less than human intelligence. The word "ape" is not capitalized, in similar fashion to the words: horse, cow, and lizard. This is because unlike the Indian or the Negro, the ape is not considered a race.

However, what does one do in the case of articulate, intelligent, erectstanding creatures with the features of an ape? Surely the apes on the ape planet comprise a race. Then do they not have a nationality of their own? These simians have leaders, officers, a police force/army, and a democratic forum. They have their territorial boundaries, their cities, their villages, towns, districts, and fields Thus, on the premise that the apes on the planet with which this club is concerned are both members of a race and citizens of a nation

of their own, I hereby put forth the suggestion that the "ape" be capitalized when used in reference to the population dwelling on the Planet of the Apes.
