



This past summer the various loopholes in *Terminator 2* stirred up a lot of discussion about time paradoxes. Can you change the past? The future? How would you know? Is time travel even possible? All of this is old news to followers of *Planet Of The Apes*

The first two Apes films featured characters travelling into the future, but it wasn't until the third film that the series ventured into real paradox territory. Having the characters travel into the past and precipitate events which lead to their future creates a closed loop (or perhaps strange loop would be a better term). How could Zira and Cornelius, in their past set into motion the events which lead to their future? This leads us to a problem called reverse causality—the future causing changes in the pastwhich is the same situation created in both Terminator films.

Time travel is discussed in some detail in three of the five Apes films. The orangutan Virgil, in Conquest Of The Planet Of The Apes asks many of the questions we viewers ask ourselves. Is there an answer to the questions of time travel? Is it possible to close all the loopholes and explain everything away?

I sure hope not, that would make things a lot less interesting.
