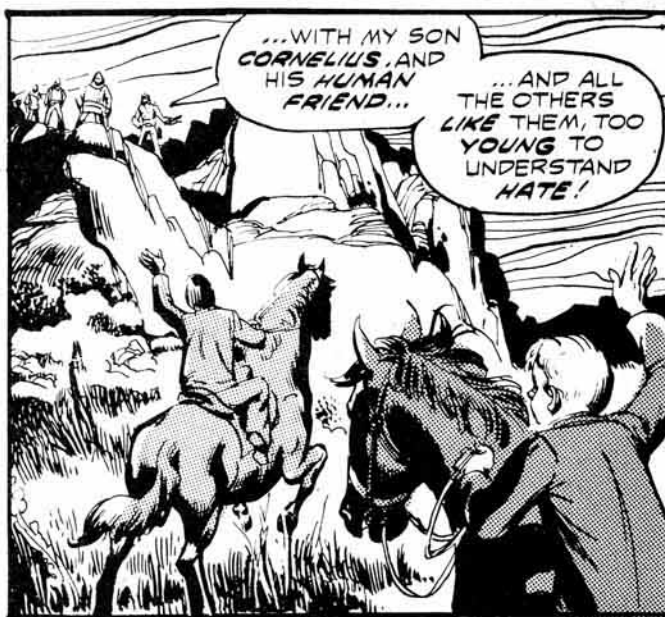

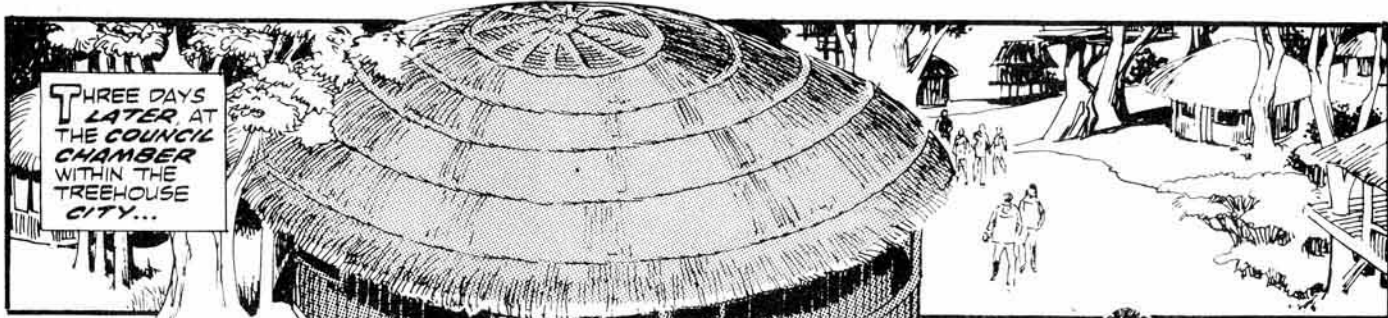

Advice? Call the mag POTA again, with the Apes strip, and an S-F short story, and alternating back-up stories like Dracula, Black Panther, Captain Marvel and Ka-zar, all of whom are catching up with their American counterparts anyway. Keep these Larkin covers coming and restore "Apes" to its former glory.

Don't worry, this letter isn't all complaints! Your latest "Psychedrome" saga is out of this world, and the Ploog/Sutton work rivals City of Nomads and Mike Ploog's charcoaled work for excellence. It's stories like
