SYNOPSIS

At the end of "Beneath the Planet of the Apes" the world was incinerated in a Doomsday chain of nuclear explosions. However, three of the intelligent and articulate chimpanzees--Cornelius (RODDY McDOWALL), Zira (KIM HUNTER) and Milo (SAL MINEO)--sensing the holocaust to come, had penetrated the wilderness and located the crashed American spacecraft which had first brought modern humans to the apes' city.

They were able to patch together its electronic gear and blast off into space a bare few minutes before the atomic catastrophe which reduced the planet to cinders. Flying swiftly backward through a bend in time many hundreds of years, they splash down off the Southern California coast. Their arrival is noted by the authorities and they are fished out of the surf.

When they remove their space helmets the Californians see for the first time that their unexpected visitors are simians, not humans. They are taken to Los Angeles for interrogation, and are treated as world-famous celebrities. They are registered at the Beverly Wilshire Hotel and taken on a tour of the smart shops so that they might have a serviceable American-style wardrobe. They address women's clubs and appear on TV.

But when it is discovered that Zira, the wife of Cornelius, is pregnant, some scientific leaders have second thoughts about the intruders and express the fear that their ability to breed might eventually pose a threat to mankind and the society he has created.

The apes retort that they have come only in friendship--but mankind has long feared the unknown, the inexplicable, and has sometimes wantonly destroyed it in order to "protect" himself and his institutions. The story explores the reactions of the United States Government and its scientific leadership to this challenge--and builds to the point wherein the participants on both sides resolve the controversy in a surprising and suspenseful climax.

PUBLICITY STORY

"Escape from the Planet of the Apes" is the third in the series of films stemming from the highly original and hugely profitable "Planet of the Apes," which producer Arthur P. Jacobs made for 20th Century-Fox four years ago.

The first film, based on Pierre Boulle's novel, "Planet of the Apes," took place in the distant future after human civilization as we know it had long been destroyed. The second, "Beneath the Planet of the Apes," continued chronologically, but in the third, Paul Dehn's original screenplay moves the period all the way back to the present day.

The simian scientists narrowly escaped the conflagrations that consumed the earth in the second film and now they travel, through a bend in time and in a handy spaceship, backward across the centuries to contemporary Los Angeles.

In "Escape from the Planet of the Apes," Kim Hunter, the only star to appear in all three films, is reunited with Roddy McDowall, who played her simian boyfriend in the first one, and her husband in this one. Both stars, in their ape makeup, get to wear fashionable modern clothes for the first time.

For the new film, producer Jacobs has added a new ape character who, in a switch in casting, is played by filmdom's longtime favorite juvenile delinquent, Sal Mineo. These three are the only ape characters in the story. Actually, there is a fourth but he is a contemporary, non-intelligent ape in a zoo who tries in his confused way to befriend the brilliant visitors. He is played by Janos Prohaska who specializes in portraying apes on the screen.

Among the contemporary human characters are Bradford Dillman and Natalie Trundy, who play animal psychiatrists; Eric Braeden, who played a brilliant scientist in "Colossus, the Forbin Project," plays another scientist here; William Windom, who played a congressman on television for several years, goes all the way up to President of the United States in this film; Ricardo Montalban, who plays the owner of a circus, and Albert Salmi, seen as the government interrogator of the articulate simians.

"Escape from the Planet of the Apes" was directed by Don Taylor who was a leading actor before turning to directing. "Escape" is his fifth feature film. He has directed dozens of television shows, too.

Besides Jacobs, McDowall and Miss Hunter, the other major veterans of the original "Planet of the Apes" on hand for the third film are art director William Creber and makeup genius John Chambers. Creber's job was simpler this time around. For the first film, he had to dream up the vast Ape City. For the second, he had to create a mutated New York City entirely underground. For the current film, he merely had to cope with present-day Los Angeles. Makeup man Chambers' job was easier too, simply because he had only three simians to deal with. One new problem involved making a baby chimpanzee resemble Kim Hunter and Roddy McDowall who are supposed to be its parents. Chambers, who worked with 20th Century-Fox makeup chief Dan Striepeke on the new film, won an Oscar for his original ape makeup for "Planet of the Apes," one of only two Oscars ever given to makeup men in the Academy's 43-year history.

EXPLOITATION

There are a number of very strong "pre-sold" elements in "Escape From The Planet Of The Apes" which must not be overlooked and which should be exploited fully:

1. This is the third in the series of Apes pictures, the first two being the highly successful "Planet Of The Apes" and "Beneath The Planet Of The Apes." There is no doubt these films have a strong following among young people as well as older movie-goers.
2. The same characters that delighted audiences in the first two films are also in "Escape" and are portrayed by the same performers - Kim Hunter as Zira and Roddy McDowall as Cornelius. The ad look features these two most prominently and adds their baby ape, Milo, in a very appealing family portrait.
3. The fascinating make-up and disguises in each film - transforming stars from human beings into believable apes - can again be made the cornerstone of a publicity campaign and converted into very exciting and effective exploitation stunts.

Apes masks will again be available thru your respective Fox Advertising and Publicity Fieldman for use in local promotions. Send a well dressed couple wearing ape masks for a stroll during lunch time or into chic places at cocktail time. Arrange a photo contest with a disc jockey or with a photo equipment store or with a newspaper - by having contestants photograph the masked couple and drop their photos off at theatres or other designated places. Suitable prizes should be arranged for best photos which can in turn be used for publicity or for humorous displays at the theatre and other locations.
