### STAR BIOGRAPHY - Hari Rhodes as MacDonald - |

Hark Rhodes graduated from the Cincinnati College Conservatory of Eusic with a B.A. degree and arrived in Hollywood with twelve Dollars and a YECA membership card. The Long hard ride from his Cincinnati ghetto was not yet over for him, however. His youth was hard. For the first ten years of his life his family had no inside plumbing and at 14 he was keeping body and soul together hustling older but inferior players in pool halls. At 15 he lied his way into the U.S. Marines. During his service he saw much action including the storming of the beach at Inchon. In Hollywood, aged 20, he earned a dollar a day sweeping out a theatre in which he played bit parts, without pay, and sleeping in an abandonded building.

It is with regret that no other information is available about Hari Rhodes.

STAR BIOGRAPHY No. 2 WILLIAM WINDOM as The President. (Escape From The Planet Of The Apes)

Windom is one of America's most overworked actors. He has appeared in countless films and T.V. series. After travelling around the US in various bit parts, he returned to his native New York, and was auditioned by the American Repertory Theatre and this led to roles in six broadway plays, mostly classics, within one year. After some months of of rejection, he left acting for insurance work. This was not the life for him however and within three years was driven to try the theatre again.

In 1950, he landed the first of what proved to be 18 broadway shows in the next eleven years.

Windom then went to Hollywood and appeared in the "Farmers Daughter" for 101 episodes as Congressman Morley. In the '60s he appeared in many series including, "Twilight Zone" "Surfside 6" "Run For Your Life" and "The Fugitive". His other films have included "The Mephisto Waltz" "The Americanization of Emily" "One Mans Way" "The Detective" and "To Kill A Mockingbird." He won an Emmy Award in 1970 for his starring role in the award winning television series, "My World and Welcome To It".
